I was excited to start this new PMI season with a wonderful spring cleanup. It was great to see so many members help preparing the club for a summer of fun. Also, I would like to

welcome all of our new members and thank all of our new board members who have stepped up to help run our club.

The big question everyone is asking is **how high will the water get?** Unfortunately we do not yet know the answer. We are taking steps to prepare for the worst. One step currently in place is a pump, set up by the pavilion - Please **Do Not Unplug It.** We will also be using a small excavator to move the pump even deeper to facilitate more water being pumped out.

We have contacted NYS Emergency Services and will be getting up to 3 Aqua Dams to protect the property. Sandbag distribution this year is different than in 2017 as it is a more involved procedure, including an evaluation and recommendations on where they should be placed. Thank you to Anthony Verno, Town of Williamson Supervisor and the High Water Coordinator for NYS who met with Jim May & Bob Hopkins at the Club to come up with our plan. People from the correctional facilities will be used to place the sand bags and the Town Highway Dept. is helping with unloading. Thank you to the many PMI members who saw the local ad re. Aqua Dams and passed it on to us. If we need members to help, we will send out an email with the day and time.

At this point in time, the beach and club are still usable to members and we are hoping they will remain that way. Please be careful along the docks and other areas where the high water might cause washouts. We have a very beautiful and unique area that sometimes requires patience and extra care. I hope all of you share my optimism that we will have a great season.

SUMMARY OF SAIL PATROL/DUTY OFFICER DUTIES

- Detailed checklist is in the Duty Officer logbook in the under counter kitchen cabinet closest to the beach
- Unlock the main gate, pavilion, and bathrooms
- Set up a Duty officer station outside the pavilion
- Hook up the radio on the kitchen counter and monitor VHF channel 16. **In an emergency if you are not completely comfortable with operating the boat or responding to a rescue or other situation, CALL 911.**
- Hang the U.S. flag on the beach flagpole
- Check the beach for trash and glass.
- Ensure bathrooms and pavilion are clean and stocked with adequate paper towels, toilet paper and trash can liners. Clean areas as necessary.
- Monitor activities on the beach and grounds for compliance with PMI rules and policies including leash policy for all dogs, parents responsible for children and individuals on the property who are not members or guests of members.
- Sign-in members and guests. A party permit is needed for 6 or more non-member in a group. Review Party Permits for the day.
- Enjoy the day at our beautiful club!

- At the end of the day, complete the duty officer checklist, empty the trash, take down the flag, put all equipment away, turn out the lights and lock the doors and gates when you leave.

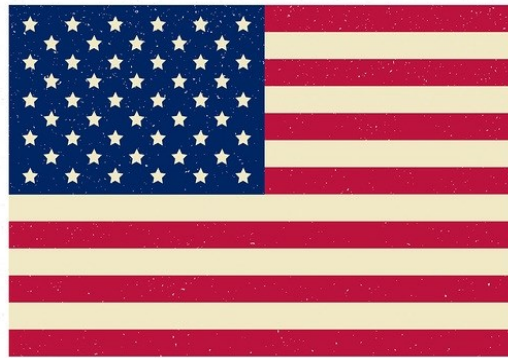
