Shoreline Regatta discussed for 2020

It was the consensus of the Committee that rebuilding the Clubhouse in some manner is necessary, and that without same, PMI membership will continue to decrease. A “pole barn” concept was presented by Chip Stevens, with a foundation that would raise the eventual structure well above the existing water table and potential beach erosion, etc. Rich Seyfried strongly recommended that the Club membership be informed that the Committee is actively working on the project to improve the clubhouse and entire property, and that effort is “Phase 1”. More to follow as we work with Cornwall LLC.

We were pleased to have Dwight & Martha McCain spend the past week visiting the area. Martha, Fred Cornwall's daughter and a member of the Cornwall LLC, was here to visit family and to see in person the damage caused by this year's high water. SUMMARY OF SAIL PATROL/DUTY OFFICER DUTIES

- Detailed checklist is in the Duty Officer logbook in the under counter kitchen cabinet closest to the beach
- Unlock the main gate, pavilion, and bathrooms
- Set up a Duty officer station outside the pavilion
- Hook up the radio on the kitchen counter and monitor VHF channel 16. **In an emergency if you are not completely comfortable with operating the boat or responding to a rescue or other situation, CALL 911.**
- Hang the U.S. flag on the beach flagpole
- Check the beach for trash and glass.
- Ensure bathrooms and pavilion are clean and stocked with adequate paper towels, toilet paper and trash can liners. Clean areas as necessary.
- Monitor activities on the beach and grounds for compliance with PMI rules and policies including leash policy for all dogs, parents responsible for children and individuals on the property who are not members or guests of members. “Welcome, can I help you
- And are you interested in joining the Club?”
- Sign-in members and guests. A party permit is needed for 6 or more non-members in a group. Review Party Permits for the day.
- Enjoy the day at our beautiful club!
- At the end of the day, complete the duty officer checklist, empty the trash, take down the flag, put all equipment away, turn out the lights and lock the doors and gates if you are the last one to leave.
