We are certainly kicking off our season with the following number of sailboats:

27 sunfish

20 lasers or laser-like Board boats

18 monohull sailboats for the Dock wall or for day launching

21 catamarans

AND...Wise words borrowed from Deb Arndt....

* Boats, boats, boats! Boat courtesy is important! Remember, store boats in their assigned locations and sticker your boat.

Remember the **BOATS** rule:

B for Beach: Boats may be placed overnight on the beach for no more than 24 hours and well back from the shore to allow for maintenance. Keep the beach launching lane clear at all times.

O is for Others. Remember to be considerate of others and their boats. Please don't relocate/ move others' boats without checking with the Dockmaster. Close and lock gates and bathrooms (lights off) if you are the last one leaving the property. Please don't place boats where they impede member access or property maintenance. When parking your vehicle, please don't block boat and trailer movement on the lawn.

A is for Assignment. Place your boat only in your assigned location: either in sheds, 'dry sail' locations on the South Lawn or Cat Island, or Wall dock.

T is for Take the Time to maintain the lawn around your drysail area at least biweekly. You should be able to move your boat and trailer out of the current spot to allow you to mow. The lawn mower is in the patrol shed.

S is for Sticker! Remember to sticker all boats and your cars, too. For sheds, place stickers on the end of the boat facing the shed doors.

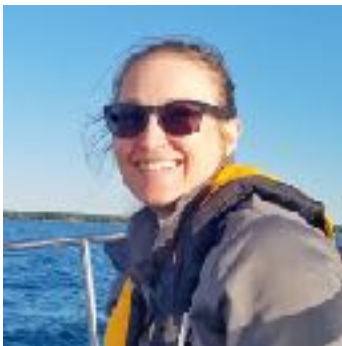
Beach season is here! As a part of membership responsibilities, all members (who are not board members) are required to sign up for a duty officer shift.
