Volunteer Opportunities (Skill involved)

New shed arrived, check it out. Need to

1. Move items from the old shed to the new shed.
2. Build shelves to store propane tanks, Sail patrol cabinets and sail patrol boat gas tanks stand. The new shed has 8 foot walls. Think of going vertical with items.
3. Need to have room for the dinghy fleet race markers, ropes, weights, etc.
4. We have some stone on site which will be used to build a ramp to the new shed.
5. If someone wants the old shed, you will be required to remove it from the PMI property, If no one wants the shed, it needs to be taken down, cut up and put in the dumpster (Blue Frog). Be careful not to overload the dumpster. We have the dumpster emptied every other Friday.



Someone is needed to design the **new dock deck**, and come up with a workable solution to cover the new ramp dock wall. This deck will be the walkway to assist launching and retrieving mono hull boats and will also be the walkway to the sail patrol boat. We have and will engage PYC to borrow their maintenance boat to assist in the deck rebuild.

The **sail patrol boat** has some damage to the hull. This will need to be fixed before the boat can be launched. It also needs to have the bottom cleaned and the zebra mussels scrapped off.

Obviously, the boat rubbed on something that damaged the forward starboard section of the hull. This will NEED to be repaired before the boat reenters the water. It will need both fiberglass and gelcoat repair. I have some limited experience, but anyone who has actually looked at my repair work... well lets just say, it ain't pretty.

There are several areas that would benefit from gelcoat repair while the major repairs are done.



Water at the Club, showers, sinks, cooking...

We will have water soon. Right now, weather seems to be an issue, also worker availability. We took time to hand dig the water line to assist the contractor in its location. We are still on a temporary hose which supplies the club water. The PMI board has approved new sink faucets for the bath house. The old ones just leak too much. These will be two handle styles. We are moving away from the single handle due to seasonal changes when the water is shut off.

The Beach will be cleaned on Friday or Saturday morning, depending on Antonio's work schedule. If you are storing your boats on the beach, please pull them up tight to the grass line towards the East side. If you bring a chair down to the beach, please bring it up to the pavilion when you are done. The same goes with the sail boards. Please put them back in the rack. If you dig a hole on the beach, it needs to be filled back in before you leave the club.

Our sailing season has begun! And so it goes...

1. A reminder for those members with boats and trailers on the lawn - **it is your responsibility to mow the area around and under your boats and trailers every week or every other week.** Since our weekly lawn service mows proximal to your boat / trailer, it is also your responsibility to make sure your gear, boat lines, ropes, cables, etc are tucked away so they are not in the path of our lawn service.

a. The red lawn mower is in the patrol shed and the gas can with Non-ethanol gas is to be used. If the gas can is near empty, please let any of the board members know or fill it yourself at the Valero in town. You can seek reimbursement.

b. If you know you will not be able to maintain your lawn around your boat, please make arrangements with another member to do the lawn mowing during your absence.

2. Please send an email to me letting me know if you need boat and car stickers and the quantity.

3. For those members with storage on the sheds, if the doors are blocked due to settling over the winter, please take a shovel to clear the ground away. Shovels / rakes can be found in the utility shed 5.

4. Many of the sliding doors on the sheds are rather finicky...please slide them carefully so that they do not slide off the track at the top of the door.

Note: We are still looking for a 2024 Dock Master who will be mentored by out-going Dock Master Linda, who promises to make the transition go smoothly.

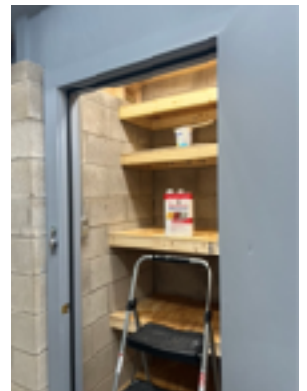
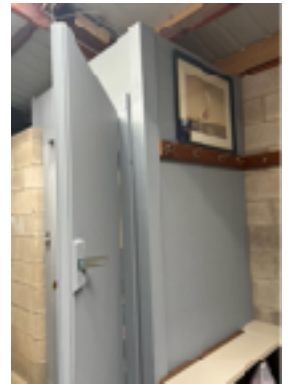
