Welcome to the beach! However, sometimes the beach is a bit yucky with green slime & seaweed. We are at the mercy of wind, waves and weather. Our beach is cleaned either Friday night or Saturday morning. Antonio, who works at a local farm, does this for PMI when he has a free moment. In addition to paying him, we provide his family with a club membership. To help him, it's important to have everything removed from the beach so that the tractor can get through. This includes chairs (if you drag it down then drag it back off the beach), surfboards (put them back in the rack), picnic tables, toys (put them back in the toy box). Also note: no glass is allowed on the beach! And all holes need to be filled in before you leave the beach. Parents are responsible for cleaning up the beach if the little ones forget. if Antonio can not work on the beach, it won't be cleaned. Antonio usually pulls the seaweed to the East side of the beach where it is out of the way.

Some additional info:

- A group of volunteers have stepped up to take care of our power boat . It has been fixed, cleaned, and launched. *Thank You! Tom Wyble, Tom Hooker, Denise and Rich Bilsback, Bruce Hoogesteger*

-The new shed has been set up with shelves which are labeled as to where items are to be stored. *Thank you Denise & Rich Bilsbeck* for volunteering to do this. Please keep the shed neat & orderly. Race buoys have been moved to the new shed. When you use a propane tank, put it back in the shed.

-Dock decking at the launch is moving forward (somewhat) a 'C' channel has been welded in place (*Thank you Dale and Chase Shaver*) which will be the outboard deck support. We have a group of volunteers willing to tackle this.

- If you use the kitchen please clean up after. Clean the sinks, put things away, take the garbage to the dumpster, take leftovers home, and remember **NOT to put grease, butter, oil or sand** down the drain. This screws up the sewer pump systems. This is a big note: if we lose the sewer pumps, we shut down the club until they can be fixed.

So now that you know how much our Club depends on YOU, enjoy! ... and look around to see where you can help. Volunteering is how we get things done!
