On the Water at PMI, from Rich Bilsback

Our club needs members to operate our sail patrol boat to set up race marks and to assist members out on the water. In addition to the NYS Boating Safety Certificate, PMI members who operate the Sail Patrol boat need training on the set up and operation of the club's Boston Whaler. To receive the PMI Sail Patrol boat training, please contact Rich Bilsback at 585-748-8578.

By the way, members have found that the BoatUS boating safety course (free or donation) is more up to date and user friendly than the US Power Squadron course.

On the Beach and in the Water:

- * Sailboats in beach area have the right of way.
- * Adults need to supervise their children at all times.
- * Children may not play on rocks along the point or upon the wooden channel walkway.
- * Beach toys and paddle boards need to be put away and holes from sand building filled in when you leave
- * All should wear life vests on boats or if paddling beyond shallow water
- * Do not swim in the channel

Duty officers should get email reminders a couple days before their shift. They will find the binder, American flag, and first aid bag on the desk inside the Pavilion. There is a "how to" sheet inside the binder and duty officer check off sheets inside.

Each duty officer should sign the sheet for that day at the end of their shift to ensure that they get credit for their service.

I will post a list of who is on duty on the refrigerator so members know who to contact if they need something.

The first aid kit is stocked with almost anything you might need. Cold packs are in the freezer next to the desk. There are 2 hot packs that can be heated for 1 min in the microwave in the first aid kit.

Members have the responsibility to know and follow the club rules and clean up after themselves. It is not the duty officers job to clean up after members.

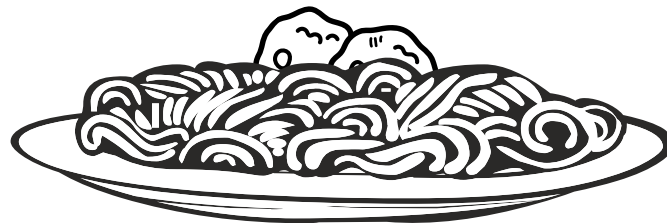
